Movie shows how communities can save lives

Herb, a school janitor, was sweeping a hallway when struck with a heart attack. Within minutes a Harrison Township life support unit arrived, administered treatment and stabilized the victim.

Then, Herb got up and watched the incident on video tape.

Fortunately, Herb's "heart attack" was only staged. Students in a television production class used this dramatization as part of their final examination tape at Madonna College, Livonia. The tape, titled "Life Support Unit - Macomb County," illustrates the need for community life support systems.

The tape will be shown to homeowners groups, city councils and other organizations in communities that don't have this type of system to encourage them to get into it," said student director Robert Markus of Harrison Township.

Markus is chairman of the operations committee of the Macomb County Emergency Medical Service Council.

Markus enrolled in the Madonna College course specifically to learn production of public relations and training tapes. He wrote the script for this final examination and involved other class members in its production.

Nurses, teachers and safety engineers are among those who have taken the course to produce their own instructional tapes.

In addition to the heart attack dramatization the 30-minute tape features a talk by Bill Broadwick, chairman of the public information committee of the Macomb County EMS Council.

Broadwick explains the Macomb County life support system and the benefits such a system can provide for a community. Other aspects of the life support system are discussed with Bruce James, Macomb County EMS coordinator, and firefighter Ken Dembacher of Harrison Township.

Students involved in the production were director, Robert Markus; Harrison Township, technical director, Robert McLaughlin; Lincoln Park, audio, Pat Derry; Dexter, narrator, Kay Marie Lark; Southfield, camera, Pat Kavanagh; Detroit, Barbara Di Manno; Livonia, Alfreda Kowalczyk; Garden City, Kay Lark and Robert Markus.

Other cast members included Capt. Paul Remillard and firefighter Roger Cramer of Harrison Township Fire Department; Ted Martfield, Lathrup Village; Fred Beck, Harrison Township; Roberta Markus, Harrison Township; Ilene Rosemeck and Mario Di Manno, both of Livonia.

The Madonna course was taught by Charles Derry, a director at WXYZ-TV.

Women's business workshop at WSU

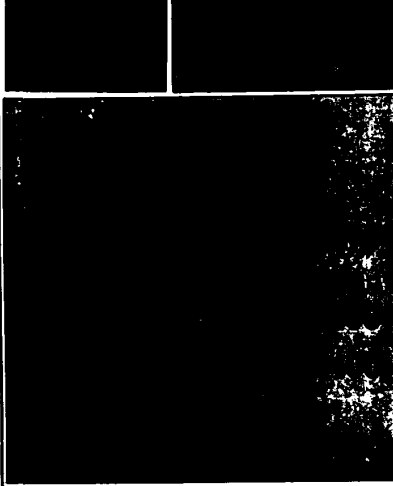
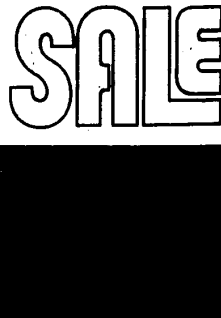
