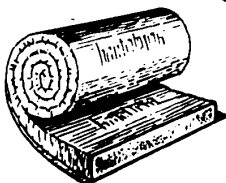

### A LEXICON OF WITCH WORDS

**Part I**  
**cartomancy**—card reading.

## Hampton to step down from bench next year

Oakland County Circuit Court Judge William P. Hampton said the week that he would not seek re-election to a new term next year.

He indicated that he plans to re-enter the practice of law next January with the firm of Davidson, Gotshall, Kohl, Nelson, Secret, Wardle and Lynch in Farmington Hills when his term is up.

Judge Hampton, 38, was elected to the Circuit Court in 1973 following his original appointment to the court in 1970 by Governor William Milliken. He served as the court's presiding judge for one year as well as an officer of the State Judges' Association.

He said that although he is scheduled to assume the presidency of the Michigan Judges' Association in September, he will forego it to assume the practice of law.

He said: "I feel privileged to have served on what I consider to be the finest trial court in the United States. It is with mixed emotions that I leave the bench, however, after 12 years of public service. I believe that the end of this term is the appropriate time."

Hampton, his wife and three children live in Bloomfield Hills. He formerly served in the Michigan House of Representatives for six years, four of those as Republican Floor Leader.

In 1970 he was named one of the five outstanding young men in Michigan by the Michigan Jaycees. He is currently serving on the Governor's Commission on Criminal Justice.

Farmington Postmaster Kenneth B. Harris reminds customers of some regulations which aid mail delivery to homes and places of business.

Customers are required to keep the approach to the mailbox cleared of snow. This permits the carrier to mount the route to drive up to the mailbox to deliver and collect mail without leaving his vehicle.

The approach to, and exit from, the mailbox should be sufficiently clear on both sides to allow the carrier to drive ahead and not be required to back up his vehicle after delivery.

Postmaster Harris says that postal regulations require that walks, steps and porches be kept clear of snow and ice.
