Feminist writes book of poems

Sisters and Other Selves, by Judith McCombs, has been published by The Glass Bell Press and is now available in local bookstores in Detroit and Ann Arbor. The author is a Farmington resident and co-founder of Moving Out, the nation's oldest surviving feminist literary arts magazine. The magazine came as a result of a two-day conference at Wayne State University which McCombs claims was one of the biggest events in the feminist movement in the Detroit area. Her co-founder, Margaret Kaminski, has since founded the Glass Bell Press in Detroit and has just completed editing Moving to Antarctica, a women's anthology.

Ms. McCombs is a teacher of literature and creative writing at the Center for Creative Studies, a Detroit arts college. She has just finished a book-length manuscript titled "Kissin' Nature: Wilderness Poems."

She has been widely published mostly in feminist magazines here and in Canada. Five of the book's poems from "Sisters and Other Selves" were featured in the Hamtramck anthology of feminist writing called We Bloom, Now.

'Walk Thru the Bible' to be led by Baptists
