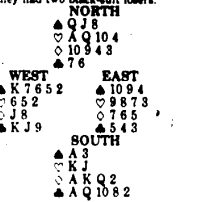


BRIDGE

The hand in the diagram was encountered at the Valentine Sectional in Southfield last weekend. Those with expertise limited to the finesse, found they had two black-suit losers.



North South Vulnerable South Deals

 West led the six of hearts. Al Silber, of Birmingham, active in bridge circles for many years, is capable of giving lessons to young and older players alike. He had a section top and ranked overall.
 He made no mistake on the hand in the diagram. He won the opening heart lead with the king, won three top diamonds and crossed to dummy by overtaking the heart jack with the queen.
 After winning the heart ace, he took the deep club finesse. West won with the jack and was end-played.

A club lead would have established the club suit, so West led a spade. Dummy won with the queen. The spade ace, diamond ten and heart ten were played at tricks nine, ten and eleven respectively.
 West had to keep the spade king to keep declarer from winning a trick with the spade jack. This left his club king unprotected so declarer played the club ace and queen in that order for the slam.

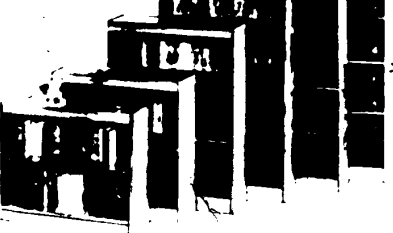
