

# No time for nerves

It's over.

But I still can't receive a wedding invitation without a shudder.

That neat black script swirling across parchment stationery cheerfully requesting the honour of my presence gives me a sinking stomach and eye strain.

With a wary look I recall that just a few months ago I was working feverishly to get all the details out of the way so I could get down the aisle.

Weddings I have now decided allow no time for jittery nerves or sweaty palms. There are too many details to be resolved.

Take for example a typical Saturday preceding the wedding day.

The invitations complete you are left with queries about the napkins for the wedding cake.

Do you, the sales person asks, want napkins with a scalloped or unscalloped edge? Would you prefer gold or silver lettering? And what shall we read: William and Susan, Susan and William, Bill and Sue or vice versa?
