

Delegate deadline nears

An important deadline in the Michigan Republican Party's process of nominating a presidential candidate will be March 26 at 4 p.m. Candidates for precinct delegate

must file nominating petitions with the Oakland County clerk by that date. Republican candidates can get petition forms from either Oakland County clerk's office or from Oakland County chairman Art Elliott (224-8881).

Under a new state law, Democrats will pick their precinct delegates at the August general primary. But Republicans will use the 1977 procedure of choosing delegates at the May 18 presidential primary.

Precinct delegates are elected to attend three county or district conventions to select state delegates. On May 27, they will pick state delegates who will choose national convention delegates to reflect district votes.

In August, after the statewide primary for U.S. Congress and Michigan Legislature, delegates will meet again to elect

state delegates who will nominate GOP candidates for State Supreme Court, State Board of Education and governing boards of three state universities.

In January of 1977, local delegates will choose district party leaders and set up another state convention where a state central committee and party chairman will be elected.

In addition to this legal side of the job, the party expects delegates to organize in their precincts for canvassing, distributing literature, serving telephone centers and challenging at polls.

To run for precinct delegate, a candidate must have between 15-20, no more, signatures of registered voters from his precinct. The candidate may indicate his presidential preference or remain uncommitted.
