Doctor to talk on fasting

Dr. Jack Goldstein, Livonia podiatrist and foot surgeon, will speak on fasting at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, April 16, in the Seventh Day Adventist Church Academy, 13250 Southfield, north of Fennell, Detroit. Dr. Goldstein suffered from ulcerative colitis for seven years and faced surgery, but instead he fasted for six weeks under the supervision of a New York fasting practitioner.
