The tribute will be announced at the 10th annual B'nai B'rith presidents' brunch Sunday, April 25, at Congregation Beth Abraham-Hillel, 45075 W. Maple, West Bloomfield. The brunch will be held in cooperation with the Jewish National Fund.

Another goal of the brunch is to complete the Fourth Detroit Forest of 10,000 trees honoring the past presidents of the men's and women's councils who served prior to 1960. Gardens of 100 trees will be planted in honor of each current lodge and chapter president.

B'nai B'rith has 13,000 members in the metropolitan Detroit area and is the largest Jewish organization in the world with 300,000 members.

Bittker is a native Detroit and a graduate of the University of Michigan. He is a past president of Central Lodge and is on the executive board of the Jewish Community Council. He is a vice-chairman of the Michigan Region of the Anti-Defamation League, member of the boards of the Wayne State University Hillel Foundation, B'nai B'rith Youth Organization and Covenant Credit Union.

A partner in the National Lumber Company, he is past president of the Construction Industry Credit Group. He and his wife, Arlene, and their three children are active in Congregation Adat Shalom.

Mrs. Ellis is a past president of Ivan S. Bloch Chapter and has served the Women's Council as treasurer and vice president. She is vice chairman of the Michigan Regional Advisory Board of the B'nai B'rith Youth Organization and is a member of the Advisory Board of the Anti-Defamation League.
