

amount of Americanization, which included the removal of all decoration except George Washington engraved buttons

There was, however, a turn to France, a change that was partly the result of Ben (amin Franklin's popularity there. Men and women clamored for news of Parisian tash ions and, in the process, began a trend that took more than 150 years to end.

Even the politics and philosophy of the 1823 Monroe Doctrine couldn't stop American interest in French tashion. News came in letters, and early publications printed French designs or their American copies.

But the luxury and elegance that was redeveloping in the east did not occur in the midwest. There, settlers concerned them selves with functional clothing Practical fabrics such as cottons and massims replaced the silk and embroulers of the east. It was in the west in 1850 that Levi Strais came up with blue jeans.

Fen years later, it was back east to Seventh Avenue According to Bernard Rusheu author of The Rag Rave the first reference to Seventh Avenue appeared in A Scientificates for 1890.
