Jerry Silverman's understated suit with a black blazer and skirt against a white vest and print shirt will set the scene for a Michigan Inn tete a tete.

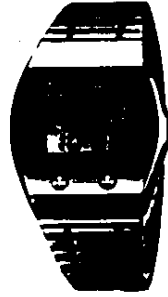
Or John Antobony's white on white on white coat, shirt and pant ensemble is a sure sign of sophistication whether you're at the Midtown Cafe or Victoria Station.
