Centaur netters win

Centaur Farms Racquet Club overcame a late charge by Square Lake Racquet Club, Saturday in West Bloomfield, to win the Metro Tennis League match by a 27-149 score.

Centaur's Senglers won 30 of 24 matches enroute to the victory, while the visiting Square Lake Shekars accumulated 149 net points, despite only four match victories.

Final scores do not reflect the suspense of the hard-fought match which kept Centaur in fourth place and Square Lake in fifth place of the Metro Tennis League Standings. Both teams have completed eight games and have two more league matches to play this season.

Centaur's Senglers finished the women's singles matches with an 86-55 lead over the Shekars from Square Lake. Centaur's women have only lost one match this season.

However, at the end of the men's singles matches, Square Lake had lowered the gap to only 14 points, cutting the Centaur advantage to a 77-63 margin.

Centaur players got their second wind and won all the doubles matches to post the team victory.

Centaur has 1500 points in holding down its fourth place position. Square Lake has a total of 1520 points for 15th.

Court House Tennis and Racquets Club is the league leader with 1791 points after eight matches. Oak Park is second with 2114 net points at the conclusion of regular season play.

Rochester Hills has also finished the regular season and has a total of 2023 points for third place.

Franklin's Racquet Club occupies the Metro Tennis League pillar with 1070 net points after completion of its regular season.

League leading Court House will travel to Rochester Hills, 9 p.m. Saturday, for the next league match.

After the regular season, which ends after Centaur Farms and Square Lake lock horns again on April 24, the first and second place Metro Tennis teams will compete in a post season tournament to determine the league champion.

Unionville Schooling Area School, the defending Class C state track champion, ran away with the Detroit County Day Invitational title Saturday in Birmingham.

The defending state title holders scored 41 1/2 points for the Country Day title. Detroit St. Martin DePorres was the closest to the winners with 41 points.

Detroit Country Day finished in sixth place with 16 1/2 points. Southfield Christian scored 6 points, good for a tie for 18th position, while Orchard Lake St. Mary's finished in a tie for 18th with 5 1/2 points.

Last year's Country Day champion, Bath, finished close to the bottom of the team standings with only two points.

Highlights of the meet was a superlat 100 yard dash. Aided by a 28 mile per hour wind, Stan Young of DePorres crossed the finish line with a 59.5 clocking. DePorres teammate Brian Haug came in a close second with a 59.8 time.

The Country Day Yellow Jackets received a winning performance from Rick Litwin, who topped the shot 51'1" for first place in that event.

"I was very pleased," Country Day coach George Browne said. "We have a bunch of young kids, and we scored in five events, which for us I thought was excellent. We were in some pretty tough competition."

Rob Yeider placed third in the long jump for Country Day with a 20'1 1/2" jump.

Litwin also earned a sixth place in the decus with a toss of 130'9".

Koppin turned in the final individual place for Country Day when he ran a 34.1 in the 440 yard dash, good for a tie for sixth place.

Eric Larson of Southfield Christian finished the mile run in second place with 4:17.7 clocking, while teammate Tom Marks posted a sixth place time of 2:07.2 in the 880 yard run.

Sportsmen's club teaches gun safety

A 10-week junior shotgun and hunter safety course for boys and girls ages 11 to 16 will be offered beginning June 8 at Oakland County Sportsmen's Club.

An approved National Rifle Association program, the course classes will be held Tuesday evenings, 7 p.m. at the street and trap range—indoors for the first five weeks, followed by four weeks of actual shooting on the club's lighted fields.

The chief instructor will be John Crady, NRA certified former teacher in hunter safety for the Independence Township School District. He is also well-known for

his special courses in backpacking, conservation, and fishing for the Oakland County Boy Scouts for the past 10 years. Crady lives at 1238 Whittier, Waterford Township.

The junior shotgun course will be limited to 30, on a first-come registration basis. Charge for the course will be \$2.
