

Southfield High nips Seaholm

2 no-hitters for Southfield Christian ace

Southfield Christian pitcher Dennis Haney would brighten his school's baseball outlook if his first two outings are any indication.

Haney, a junior right-hander, has pitched 16 innings and has yet to give up a hit. He tossed a no-hitter at Roseville Baptist Academy as Christian won, 10-0, in the first game of a double header on April 10. Five days later, Haney no-hit Detroit Temple Christian to back his team's 5-0 victory.

Against Temple, Haney struck out six and walked three. Only one Temple runner got as far as second base. "His last ball is his best pitch, but he also has an effective curve, which keeps the batters off stride," said Southfield Christian baseball coach Bob Newman.

"He pitched a great game—don't get me wrong," Newman added. "But Temple is a first-year team, and kind of inexperienced. I don't want to play him, but I felt we had to have him anyway against a team like that."

Christian scored three runs in the third inning. With two out, Rich Lewis was hit by a pitch, and advanced to second when Dave Hlaboun was safe on an infield error. Jim Warrinski singled to load the bases. Haney then reached on another Temple miscue, and Lewis scored. Sam Collins knocked in two more runs with a single. Christian had five hits. Temple hurt its case by making four errors.

Southfield Christian, now 3-2, plays next on April 27 at Oakland Christian. The game begins at 4 p.m.

Jack Booth: Titan hurler

Jack Booth, an outstanding baseball player during his high school days at Southfield, has become one of the University of Detroit's most dependable pitchers.

Booth, a junior, led in beating back a 3-2 decision to Carson Newman College on the Titans' annual southern baseball trip. But when he bounced back to take two close wins against Wayne State University and Michigan. He was the winning pitcher in the Titans' 3-1 victory over WSU, and he held off the Wolverines in a 2-1 game.
