



Station falls prey to second robbery

For the second time in less than five months, the Maverick Oil Co., 2283 Grand River in Farmington, has been robbed at gun point.

Two armed suspects made off with \$288.77 in cash shortly after 3 p.m. Sunday, April 25.

On Dec. 12, 1975, two gunmen entered the gas station, struck the attendant on the head several times and escaped with \$225.

As a result of that robbery, an 18-year-old youth had skull surgery to repair the fractures he received in the beating.

Last Sunday afternoon two males approached the gas station while the attendant was waiting for customers.

The two suspects walked up to the station carrying what appeared to be a gas container. When they reached the front door, they put down the container.

The attendant asked if they had run out of gas, but the suspects didn't answer. Farmington police said.

One suspect asked for change and went to the phone but he never made a call, the attendant said.

WHILE ONE suspect went over to the telephone, the other remained by the door.

The suspect who asked for change sat back down and talked with the attendant.

As the attendant began to reply the suspect pulled a gun from his pocket and said: "This is a stickup."

The suspects then directed the attendant to the back of the office and took \$18 from his wallet and \$25 he used as change.

The suspects then told the attendant to remain in the back room for five minutes before calling police.

After what the attendant thought was five minutes, he walked out of the room and asked the customer to report to the police that he had been robbed, which the customer did, police said.

TECHNIQUES AND PRINCIPLES OF plant propagation, fertilizers and mixtures, containers, characteristics and requirements of individual plant species will be discussed for six weeks in the green house course. The first class will meet Wednesday, May 5, on campus at 7:30 p.m. but the remaining five sessions will be taught at Greenway Greenhouse, 2107 Glenview, Southfield. Laboratory sessions will be on Wednesday or Thursday evenings. Dr. Mary Anne Cooper Ph.D. will discuss biological processes of plant propagation and William B. Coeger MS will discuss greenhouse design and operation procedures.

LEARN TO BAKE NATURAL FOODS on Mondays and Wednesdays beginning May 10 from 12:30 to 3 p.m. A second section is offered on Mondays and Wednesdays from 6:30 p.m. The course will deal with baking and using natural food ingredients. Alan Izbicki, a graduate of the American Institute of Baking, Chicago, Ill., will instruct the class. He is also an instructor at "ICC" and the bakery superintendent at Sun Bakers, a natural foods bakery in Ann Arbor.

SAIL THE GREAT LAKES with Hadley Edwards of the Orchard Ridge Physical Education Department. The five-week course is taught on Lake St. Clair and will offer an opportunity to learn techniques of off-shore sailing, operation of sails and rigging, use of navigational charts and aids and safe procedures.

The first sailing class will meet at Orchard Ridge May 5. Three sections are offered: 12:30 p.m., 3:45 p.m. and 6:45 p.m.

Other non-credit courses being offered include: Introduction to Astrology, Aviation Ground School Basic, Beginning Intermediate Ballet, Do Something Different.
