

Native composer's stay in bicentennial concert

Hardly performed works of the 18th century will be featured at a special bicentennial concert at 3 p.m. May 2 in Southfield Lathrup High School auditorium.

"American Music Since the Landing of the Pilgrim," is the name of the program being sponsored by the Musicians Performance Trust Fund of the Recording Industry, affiliated with the Detroit Federation of Musicians. Friends of the Southfield Library and the Southfield Arts Council.

Emily Austin, violinist of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, Carl Austin, violinist, and James Tennant, cellist, will perform the first chamber music trio ever written in the United States. Composed by John Antea, the music shows the influence of Joseph Haydn.

Antea, a member of a group called the Moravian Brethren, a cultural society which originated in Prague, migrated to Bethlehem, Pa. He is believed to have known Haydn in Egypt.

She also has donated many musical scores, recordings, books, programs and photographs from Europe to the collection at the Southfield Public Library.

On May 23 she will leave for Vienna to begin a tour of Europe featuring "Music of the Jews from the Bible to the Present." The day of the concert, May 2, is being declared Marguerite Chajes Day in Southfield.

The Southfield Arts Council, one of the motivating forces behind the program, is a civic organization dedicated to promoting both the visual and performing arts within the city.

In existence for six years, the arts council sponsors scholarship programs, art festivals, the Southfield Civic Theatre and will be backing a series of six concerts in July and August at the Southfield Civic Center.

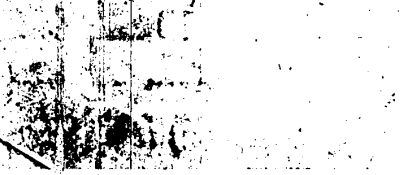
In addition, the council is planning a scholarly art show in the near future and an auction in September. Council officers will move to the Prudential Town Center soon and more cultural activities will be undertaken.
