Seminar focuses on grief

A three-hour seminar, "Growth Through Grief," is the first of what may be a series of programs for widows, widowers and those who have been confronted with tragedy.

It will be held at University Hills Church, 2671 Farmington Road 9:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. Saturday, May 15.

The seminar is being organized by Jean Petrel of St. Alban Catholic Church who stresses that it is a non-denominational seminar aimed at those who have faced grief and want to learn to cope and rebuild.

Ms. Petrel has assembled a panel of persons from the metropolitan area who have worked in many areas of grief. The Rev. Ed Battersby, chaplain of St. Mary Residence in Detroit and grief counselor, will be the keynote speaker.

Those on the panel include Dave McCabe, Farmington funeral director; Jane Shada, widow coordinator for the Detroit public schools; Jean Brindley, counselor with the Anderson Counseling Service; and Sister Margaret Russo IHM, counselor with Newman Center, Schoolcraft College.

May 15 is the pre-registration deadline for the seminar. The cost is \$5. Registrations may be made by calling Ms. Petrel, 478-1107 or writing her at 3230 Red Clover, Farmington Hills 48024. Those writing should send name, address and the pre-registration fee.

Registration at the door on the day of the seminar will be \$5.

Ms. Petrel says those attending will be asked to evaluate the program and express if they would like a continuing program and what type they would prefer.

The program idea started from a series at Schoolcraft College designed to generate interest on programs for the bereaved at a local level. Ms. Petrel is particularly anxious to draw interested persons from the Farmington, Farmington Hills and Southfield areas.
