

Brians join in celebration

When they head for Northville Saturday to take part in the state meeting of the

Michigan Association for Emotionally-Disturbed Children and special activities at the Hawthorn Center, John and Jeanne Brian of Birmingham will be taking a familiar trip.

For years now they've been going regularly to the center that has played a great part in the education of their son, and in the process they have become major movers in the organization that makes a big difference to Hawthorn.

Their efforts for the MACED—John has been president of the Hawthorn chapter and now heads the state organization and Jeanne is a leader of fund-raising ventures—have been much appreciated by the organization.

Recently the couple a special award plaque by fellow members in thank for all they have done through the years. "We were speechless," Mrs. Brian said. "So many others have done so much—I think this award should be an annual thing."

JOHN BRIAN will preside over the state meeting of the MACED, scheduled Saturday following two days of meetings for staff and former staff of the institution that probably is the largest in the nation for intensive treatment of children mentally or emotionally ill.

During the Saturday session, John Brian will report to the group on current action to battle in court a suit instituted by the Federal Office of Economic Opportunity.

The suit, he said, would give any child the right to refuse hospitalization for mental health treatment.

"Ninety per cent of mental health treatment cases involve voluntary hospitalization," Brian said, "so this affects a great number of people."

"Our organization is taking action because we feel court approval of the OEO position would disadvantage family life and remove the parent from his role of authority in the family. A child does not decide whether he will be treated for physical illness, so he should not decide in the matter of emotional illness."

JEANNE BRIAN, while attending the Saturday meeting, will have her eye on the calendar a week ahead when the Hawthorn chapter stages a rummage and bake sale at St. Matthew United Methodist Church of Livonia, 3000 W. Six Mile.

Through assorted sales and distribution of Christmas cards, the association in Michigan raises about \$2,000 a year. Last year the figure was close to \$5,000 as a special effort was made to provide extra equipment for the new Hawthorn Center wing being dedicated in the week-end activities.

"We have felt fortunate to have the center in our area and to work with a group of supportive parents," said Mrs. Brian. "Whatever we do is well worth the effort."
