

Sometimes by long distance

Candidates' views told

As of last Friday afternoon, three candidates were in the running for positions on the Southfield school board. The election is June 14.

Filing deadline for candidates is 4 p.m. Monday, May 17, at the board of education offices.

At stake are two four-year seats on the school board. The seats are now held by board members Robert Wright and Leonard Teicher.

The three candidates who have filed are Alvin R. Goldman, Allan S. Kall and Zella Robinson.

KALL, 39, of 2140 Virginia, Southfield, is an attorney with the U.S. Army Tank Automotive Command. He has been a resident of Southfield since 1960, made an unsuccessful bid for the school board in 1974 and was chairman of the recent citizens'

committee backing () April 5 millage proposal. Kall graduated from the University of Michigan and the Wayne State University Law School.

He is active in B'nai B'rith and coaches youth soccer, football and basketball. The former Oak Park and Detroit resident and his wife, Loretta, have three children in Southfield schools.

GOLDMAN, 39, of 1807 Fairfax, Southfield, is a staff developmental specialist with the Drug Abuse Reduction through Education (DARE) program of the Wayne County Intermediate School District. He is a former principal of Magnolia and McKinley elementary schools and was director of community education in Southfield. He was coordinator of the Substance Abuse Prevention program for Southfield and Lathrup Village in early stages of the program.

Goldman received bachelor's and master's degrees from Wayne State University and a Ph.D. from University of Michigan.

A Southfield resident since 1961, Goldman is a member of Kiwanis International and is past president of the Wayne State Chapter of Phi Delta Kappa. He is also a member of the National and Michigan Associations for Supervisors and Curriculum Development, a past member and director of the Southfield Homeowners' Association and was an advisor to the Boy Scouts.

Goldman and his wife, Florence, have two sons attending Southfield High School.

MRS. ROBINSON, 44, of 2738 Arlington Court, Southfield, has lived in the school district 18 years and is a former resident of Detroit.

Between 1961 and 1968, Mrs. Robinson taught elementary school in Wyndotte and at Brady and Lincoln elementary schools in Detroit. She left teaching in 1968 to raise a family but has worked as a private tutor since that time.

Mrs. Robinson received a BA in political science and elementary education from University of Michigan and did graduate work at Columbia Teachers College in New York.

She is a member of the Silver Junior High and Leonard Elementary PTAs and a Girl Scout leader at Leonard. She also is a member of the Southfield-Lathrup League of Women Voters and was a director of the Detroit LWV. In addition, she is a member of Hadassah, the Organization for Rehabilitation and Training, the U of M Alumni Association and is a Library of Congress certified Braille transcriber for the Tri-County Braille Volunteer Service. She and her husband, Ed, have two daughters, one a sophomore at U of M and one at Southfield-Lathrup High School.

THE TWO BOARD members elected will take office at the start of the 1977-78 school year this July. Board members meet for regular sessions the second and fourth Tuesday of each month. They serve without pay.

School district voters also will be asked to approve June 14 two school millage proposals: a 7.15-mill renewal and a 3.80-mill increase.

Both millage proposals must be approved by a simple majority of voters.

An estimated 62,000 residents in Southfield and Lathrup Village currently are registered to vote in the school district election.

Voting precincts for the election are not the same as the precincts established for city elections. Persons not sure of where to vote in the school election may contact the board of education offices.
