Award drama to open

The world premiere production of the Wayne State University Bicentennial Award-winning play, "The Body Parts of Margaret Fuller," by Esther Broner, has been scheduled for June 10, 11, 12 at 8:30 p.m. at the Hilberry Theatre, Cass and Hancock.

The production is part of the dual prize for the winning playwright in the competition, sponsored by the WSU Bicentennial Commission and Theatre as part of Detroit's Bicentennial observances. The other part of the prize is a \$3,000 cash award, which will be officially presented to Mrs. Broner by WSU President George F. Gullen, Jr. at the opening performance.

Esther Broner, writer-in-residence and associate professor of English at Wayne State University, is the author of the novel "Her Mother's" published in 1973 by Holt, Rinehart and Winston.

Her previous publications include two books: "Summer in a Foreign Land" and "Journal Noturnal." She has contributed stories and articles to such publications as "Commentary," "Midstream," "O Henry Prize Winning Stories" and "North American Review." Her work has appeared in the anthologies "New Campus Writing" and "Moving to Antarctica."

In her prize-winning play, "The Body Parts of Margaret Fuller," she has written a work based on the life of a 19th century woman but dealing with our own times.
