

Interior designers assist show

Lending their creative touches to the Decorators' Show House, to be held Saturday through May 23, are three area interior designers. Steel and French, Inc., of Birmingham, Duncan Fuller Interiors of Birmingham and Curiosity Shoppe, Ltd., of Franklin, are the firms represented at this major fund-raiser of the Junior League of Detroit.

The 17-room Southern Colonial home of the William B. Cudlip has

been lent to the Junior League for three weeks. Overlooking beautiful Lake St. Clair, the home has been totally decorated on the interior by 12 firms. The exterior is landscaped with myriads of azaleas and other shrubs.

The Curiosity Shoppe, Ltd., has created the Boudoir Provencal. Decorator Delphine P. Michaels has selected a color scheme of soft greys to accentuate a hand carved hunt seat in her own design, a built-in cupboard bed and an armchair. Country French in feeling, the boudoir features warm, old distressed wood and antiques.

Duncan Fuller Interiors has used an antique porcelain stove nearly to the ceiling as a focal point for their bed-sitting room. Ms. Barbara Fuller and Frank Duncan have brought classic French furniture and enhanced it with the color scheme of shocking pink, bright orange, and white for a contemporary background. Tall, folding screens in a pattern of pussy willows cover the windows and diffuse the light for relaxing.

Under the direction of Lewis Sappington and Miss Jane McMillan, Steel and French have utilized sunn colors

to cheer the kitchen, which has been updated in bentwood, glass and aluminum. Traditional English wallpaper, set off by a bright teal blue carpeting, complete the look of an up-to-date mood.

Decorators' Show House is open daily Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m.-4 p.m., Wednesday evenings from 7-9, and Sunday afternoons from 1-4. Tickets may be purchased at the door for \$4.00.

Ongoing visual demonstrations on Mondays and Fridays, a boutique with 150 consignees on the third floor of the home, and Garage Greenery offering a multitude of unusual plants and pots are all featured at the Decorators' Show House. All furniture, lamps and decorative accessories may be purchased.
