

# Farmington trackmen defeat W.L. Central

Farmington High's Kevin Hansen won two individual events to help the Falcons defeat Walled Lake Central, 14-13, Wednesday in an Inter Lakes League track meet. The trip lifted Farmington to 3-0 in the ILL and 4-3 overall.

In other area track meets last week, Southfield-Lathrup defeated Waterford Township, 12-10, and Westland-Most defeated Southfield High, 7-5-4.

Farmington's Hansen won the shot put with a 50 feet two inch heave, and the discus with a 129' 10 inch throw.
