The heavy cribing beams, wood floors and silver doreis make the home look like an old English farm cottage.

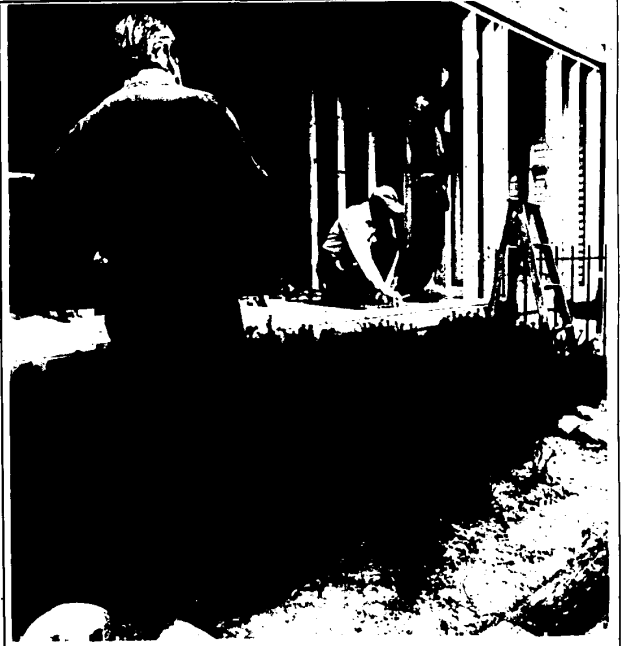
Rain, sleet, snow don't phase scouts
