be invited to have his blood typed and his blood pressure taken, free of charge. He may leave his youngsters to watch a health movie especially for children and be entertained by a magician and clown while he takes one of two guided tours. On the mini-tour, visitors will see the x-ray and laboratory areas, the emergency room and the critical care complex. A longer tour will include the pulmonary function, physical therapy, surgery, pharmacy, central labor and delivery room areas. Tour groups, led by Red Cross volunteers and hospital staff members, will assemble in the lobby at 2 p.m.

In addition to creating community awareness, the hospital hopes, through these annual open houses, to break down fears about procedures and stimulate people to seek instruction on life-saving techniques from the American Heart Association.

The "Ring of Life" and CPR will be demonstrated. The visitor will see the treatment of heart attack by cardio-pulmonary resuscitation and the treatment of obstructed air passages by the Heimlich's Manoeuvre.

LWV rescue probe vowed to continue

The West Bloomfield Farmington League of Women Voters has pledged to continue its study of an emergency medical service (EMS) for the area as well as a possible county or regional EMS system. The study was adopted as part of the LWV's 1976 program after County Commissioner Mary Dearborn's talk on EMS at the league's 20th annual luncheon meeting held at Pine Lake Country Club. Mrs. Dearborn (D-22), told league members: "What we have now in Oakland County, except for Southfield, is a couple of ambulances."

Southfield has an effective EMS system for its residents. Adding that such a system has to be keyed to a police or fire department, she said the first thing Farmington Hills needs to do is get a professional fire department. She favors a countywide system centralized at the Oakland County Sheriff's Department. To do this, she said, "Local units will have to give up some autonomy."

Prohibitive costs plus the cooperation of a coordinating hospital are two factors standing in the way of such an area system, she said. IN HER TALK, Mrs. Dearborn also criticized Oakland County's new executive form of government, saying it has "caused many more problems than it has resolved."

She suggests changing the setup of the board of commissioners, decreasing its 27 members and going to a full-time board with members having staggered terms. She also supports the county's having a charter "written by a charter committee elected in Oakland County. I'm afraid Public Act 128 (creating the existing system) has delayed that."

To perform a service, staff doctors will give blood pressure tests and advise the person if he is within the normal range or in need of help from his private physician. The hospital is at 2890 Grand River at Eight Mile.
