Volunteers

THE WOMEN'S RESOURCE CENTER
 AT KIMBROUGH COLLEGE in Livonia needs women, 18 and over, with minimum typing skills to type cards for the Agency and their library. A weekly commitment of two or three hours every week between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. is desired. The work should be complete in two or three months.

ST. JOSEPH MERCY HOSPITAL in Pontiac needs volunteers in several areas including back or front desk in the emergency out patient clinic, days, evenings and weekends. Retirees are welcome. Volunteers direct patients in the hospital, assist with wheelchairs, register patients and keep them informed of the patients progress. Volunteers are also needed to help in the Flower Room, the Gift Shop, and Bookmobile, with clerical duties, horticultural and or physical therapy. Training is provided.

10TH DISTRICT COURT PROBATION DEPARTMENT, Pontiac, needs mature volunteers, particularly men, to meet with probationers on a one-on-one basis once a week. Most probationers are young (17 to 25 years) and first offenders in need of a positive relationship with a stable, well-directed volunteer. A six-month commitment with a minimum of six hours spent with the probationer each month is required. Training sessions are provided (total of six hours) beginning in late May.

League for the Handicapped-Goodwill Industries will offer several volunteers interested in working with visually impaired young men and women a seven-week summer pre-vocational social adjustment program.

The program will run June 28 to Aug. 13, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

It will provide recreational exposure and social adjustment for a group of 15 visually impaired persons in the 15-25 age group, who, because of their handicap, have had limited experiences. Included are mobility instruction, a variety of field trips including some businesses, and recreational areas.


