Plant Gourds Now For Fun In Fall

Fun for fall -- with gourds of many sizes and shapes, begins in spring, when the seeds are planted. Since gourds are easy to grow, perhaps their culture could be left to the youngsters in your family.

Choose a warm, sunny spot to plant gourd seeds, one where there is or can be a support upon which the vines can climb.

The better the soil, the flatter the more vigorous the vines and the greater the crop of gourds.

Should the soil be poor, it can be improved by adding organic matter of some sort (granulated peat moss, compost, manure, spent mushroom soil or what have you) before seeds are sown.

These should be soaked overnight before planting, then set far enough apart to allow the individual vines to develop fully. It takes about 15 days for seeds to sprout. Meanwhile keep the soil moist.

After seeds have sprouted, the idea is to keep vines growing rapidly. Deep watering once a week, fertilizer once a month, will help. Vines, once they're trained to the support, will climb by themselves.

The forms of gourds are many and fascinating. You can plant seeds of a mixture of fancy, small-fruited kinds or those of separate sorts like miniature bottle, nest egg, hedgehog, spoon, tassel or warted gourds.

OR YOU can grow the big fellows -- Hercules club, powder horn, dipper, turk's turban, serpent. Don't these names intrigue you?

The objects you can make from gourds will be too -- but in order to make them in fall you'll have to sow gourd seeds now.

Hints On Planning Outdoor Dining Area

The popularity of al fresco dining has prompted many families to set up outdoor dining areas for use throughout the warm weather season, for family dining and entertaining guests.

Homemakers who have such an area, properly planned and furnished, usually find that serving outdoor meals is as easy as setting out the tableware, according to style consultant June Woodward.

dining table can become a buffet server while guests enjoy the meals at conveniently situated chairs and small tables.

5. Scatter random seating and occasional tables throughout the lawn area to eliminate congestion at the serving area.

6. Provide adequate light for your serving area. While permanent electric fixtures are ideal, there are portable electric lawn lights and liquid-nel torches that can be used.

BASED ON her experience, she offers these tips to help homeowners:

1. Try to place your principal outdoor dining area close to the house in an area that's relatively sheltered and free of traffic.

2. A well-made table and chair set is the heart of your outdoor dining area. Choose furniture that's heavy enough to withstand sudden gusts of wind and that can't be easily tipped by people sitting and standing.

3. For extra stability, put your table and chairs on a level paved area, such as a brick or concrete surface.

4. Provide extra random seating and occasional tables for parties and barbecues. Your

Summer Car Care Calls For Removing Aerosols

While getting your car ready for the hot weather driving ahead, don't overlook the inside of the trunk or the glove compartment.

If you have any pressurized aerosol cans stored in either place, it is best to remove them for the summer, Chevrolet experts say. Federal regulations require all such containers to bear a notice that they should not be stored where the temperature exceeds 120 degrees F.

The trunk or glove compartment of a tightly closed car parked in the sun can reach oven-like temperatures far in excess of that figure, Chevrolet says.

In individual cans. If not removed and stored in a cool place, extreme heat could cause pressure buildup in the can, forcing the nozzle seal and discharging the contents. The stickiness of the substance, which makes it so effective in improving traction, could cause a very messy cleanup job.

This precautionary measure is a notice that they should be removed from the car for summer driving. Here are others:

Check cooling system and hoses. Exercise care in removing the radiator cap when the engine is hot. Modern cooling systems are pressurized and removing the cap too quickly can result in a gushing of hot liquid. Turn the cap to the secondary lock position and wait until the pressure is relieved before removing completely.

Check all engine belts for ruts, wear, or glazing, and tighten hose connections, replacing any that are worn or cracked. Remove any accumulation of leaves, caked mud, or other obstruction from front of radiator. If coolant is dirty or rummy or has been in use for 24 months or more, drain and flush system before refilling with permanent anti-freeze solution or water with rust inhibitor added.

Inspect air conditioning system for proper belt tension and check sight glass for proper charge level. If engine overheats in slow traffic, put transmission in neutral and speed up the engine.

Check the transmission fluid level and, if low, consider a complete change if near the scheduled change mileage, or

bring up to level with specified approved fluid. If you haul a trailer, remember it puts an additional load on the transmission.

Replace windshield wiper blades for summer driving if they streak. Wiper ice, salt, and road sand are hard on them. Use an approved solvent to remove oil and bug film.

Check tires for winter wear and proper inflation when cold, not hot. Rotate tires as recommended in owner manual for maximum life, including spare.

Check brake linings for wear and proper operation, particularly if you are carrying heavy vacation loads.

Have an engine tune-up, if needed, and change oil if lighter weight was used during the winter.

Check the exhaust system carefully for rust or solder damage -- including tail pipes, mufflers, and connections. Cold slush and water on a hot exhaust system during winter is exceptionally hard treatment.

Chevrolet service men also point out that spring checkups on cooling systems and engines take on added importance now that new cars are equipped with exhaust emission controls.
