Wayne State University's Hilberry Theatre has announced plans for its first season of summer repertory.

Featuring, "A Flea in Her Ear," will open the season on July 24. The farce will alternate evenings with "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum," the musical comedy.

Another first will be the production of a children's play, "Aladdin and the Wonderful Lamp," for matinee performances.

In announcing the summer repertory, Wayne's theatre director Leonard Leon said it was designed to satisfy a two-fold need.

"We want to counteract the city's cultural slow-down in the summer, when people tend to have more leisure time and most children are out of school," he said. "We also feel responsible to our own students to provide a program in which they can continue to practice and perfect their craft during the summer months."

The season will continue for six weeks, closing August 30.
