

# BRIDGE

The hand in the diagram was encountered in a special game held by the Michigan Bridge Association last Sunday. The event was won by Charlotte and Sam Charfoos of Birmingham. They topped a field of 168 pairs with a 71 percent game.

The number of bidding sequences is probably equal to the number of pairs who played the deal. In the sequence shown, North's two notrump shows both minor suits. East and West have the advantage since they have both majors, but North is in control. There are three aces in hand.

West led the seven of hearts.

In aggressive partnerships, neither side is likely to stop bidding, and neither should, unless North-South stop short of game. If they do, East-West should quit, but it is difficult to do so. The story might be the value of aces. With three aces, this is both defensive strength and the controls that enable the partnership to make six with only 21 high card points.

A spade lead gives declarer the most problem, but dummy is forced to forget the finesse and play the diamond ace. Another trump is an entry to the South hand to play the heart ace and discard the losing spade. One club is South's only loser.

Once North-South reach the slam, they could be doubled, but the best East-West can do is bid again and go down three for a 500 point sacrifice.
