TED'S TRIVIA.

1) When and how did Ted's begin?

A. In the summer of 1934, a house trailer on Woodward Avenue, Bloomfield Hills became Michigan's first Drive-In restaurant. "Ted's Trailer" grew rapidly with the expanding auto industry, and the term "Woodwarding" was born.

2) What was Ted's called before "Old Town Inn"?

A. Strangely, Ted's was known as "Ted's" prior to gaining its present tag. Before that, it was known as Ted's Trailer, but then, we let that one out in the first question.

3) Where did the Sunday Brunch originate in this area?

A. Back in 1957, Ted's gave this area a nice Easter present. The first Sunday Brunch. The concept was so fabulously successful that the buffet became a weekly feature. And the idea spread like wildfire to competitors attempting to imitate Ted's. The name "Brunch" of course, is derived from the late morning "breakfast-lunch." Earlier names such as "Fastlunch" were rejected.

4) Who was the first entertainment to play at Ted's?

A. In September of 1972, Bobby Laurie started making music in Ted's main dining room. Today a bigger, 20s-era themed room called Gatsby's showcases the best entertainment around. The popular group, "LORIO" is the current attraction, Tuesday through Saturday. Only the best entertainment graces the Gatsby's stage. Over the years Ted's has been forced to disappoint jugglers, sword-swallowers, comb-players, animal acts and the like who would attempt to ride the coat-tails of Ted's success.

5) How did Ted's gain its reputation for foot long hotdogs?

A. Simple. Ted's invented the foot-long. There is no truth to the rumor that Ted's hotdogs originally came with feet, although Grampa Ted's was known to have put his foot in his mouth more than once.
