## Brodhead to discuss occupational health

Michigan Rep. William M. Brodhead, D-11th, and an official from the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare will address the problems of occupational health, especially respiratory disease prob-

lems, at the annual meeting of the American Lung Association of Southeastern Michigan, June 22.

The program will take place at the Merry College Conference Center, 8200 W. Water Drive, Detroit, following noon lunch and election of officers.

Title of the meeting is "Warning: Work Conditions may be Dangerous to Your Health." A program about occupational health from two viewpoints: Legislative and Administrative.

Joining Rep. Brodhead at the podium will be Joseph K. Wagner of NIOSH's National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH).

The meeting of the Christmas seal agency is open to the public. Information regarding attendance and luncheon reservations can be obtained by calling the Lung Association, 961-1887.

THE SPEAKERS will address occupational health with specific application to southeastern Michigan.

The Consumer Protection and Finance Subcommittee on which Brodhead serves has legislative jurisdiction over toxic substances and product safety. He has co-sponsored bills to provide health insurance for unemployed workers and to protect certain rights of senior citizens.

Brodhead was elected to the 17th Congressional District in Detroit in 1974. He is a graduate of Wayne State University and the University of Michigan law school.

During two terms in the Michigan House of Representatives, 1973-74, he was cited for his record of support for environmental protection measures, an area of special concern to the lung association.

WAGNER HAS BEEN responsible for the conduct of nationwide studies, surveys and analyses to determine the health status of the working population and to determine chronic and long-term effects of work related exposures to toxic and hazardous substances.

He has authored or cosponsored more than a dozen publications on subjects about pulmonary problems and lung cancer among miners and other topics. He joined NIOSH in 1971 as director of the division of field studies and clinical investigations.

Wagner has degrees from Harvard University school of public health, University of Minnesota school of public health (S.M.), and the College of St. Thomas St. Paul, Minn. (B.S.).

## Kidney disease meet planned

Several internationally-known experts in the field of kidney disease will be among some 750 doctors, dentists, nurses, social workers, and other kidney disease specialists convening in Dearborn at the Hyatt Regency Hotel June 11-13 to share information on the latest techniques in the management of renal disease.

The meeting is being sponsored by the Kidney Foundation of Michigan, the North Central Dialysis and Transplant Association, and the American Association of Nephrology Nurses and Technicians.

Its purpose is to update renal disease specialists on the latest advances in the treatment and rehabilitation of victims of kidney failure, according to Dr. Gerald A. Rieg, chairman. He is assistant professor of internal medicine at the University of Michigan Medical Center, and director of the nephrology section of Wayne County General Hospital.




