Detroit Lions lineman Bob Kowalkowski of Farmington was recently selected 1975 Dodge-NFL Man of the Year.

The competition, in which fans voted to select individual club winners in the participating NFL cities, was coordinated by the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

The award honors outstanding citizenship, and, as a result, a \$1,000 Dodge scholarship has been established in Kowalkowski's name. It went to David Janusz, a

student at St. Mary College in Orchard Lake. Janusz, 20, a 1974 graduate of St. Mary Preparatory School, was chosen by the school's board of administrators on the basis of financial need.

The scholarship will enable him to continue his liberal arts studies at the college. He is active in both baseball and football in college.

The award was made at a luncheon meeting of the Detroit Sports Broadcasters Association last month.

Kowalkowski was selected for both civic contributions and athletic ability.

A 10-year Lion veteran, he also sponsors a golf tournament to benefit the Leader Dog School for the Blind in Rochester, is chairman of the Danny Thomas March and is co-chairman of St. Jude Children's Hospital Radiothon.

Altogether, \$20,000 in Dodge-NFL scholarships are being distributed in the 28 participating NFL cities.

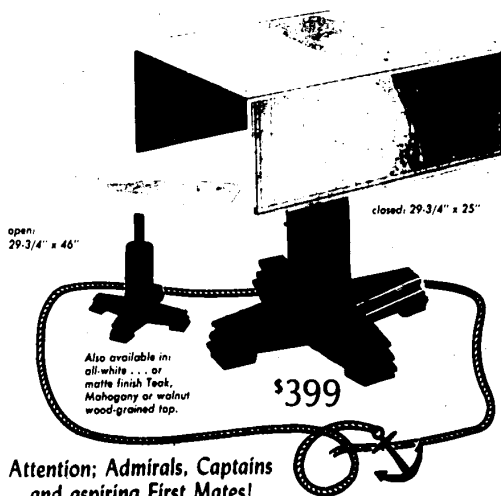
