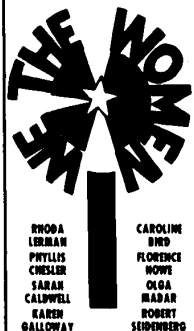

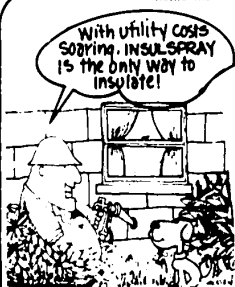

# 21 file for 6 county offices

A full slate of candidates from both major political parties will be on the ballot this year for Oakland County's six county-wide offices.

A total of 21 candidates declared their candidacies last week by filing nominating petitions or paying a filing fee with the county clerk's office before the Tuesday deadline.

One would-be candidate, Jack Rose of Southfield, was ruled off the ballot in the Republican primary for county prosecutor by the county's civil court. Rose is not a licensed attorney and faces criminal charges for an alleged plot to murder Rose's former wife a divorce several years ago.

In the Republican primary, incumbent prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson of Clarkston and E. Leonard Howarth of Dearborn are seeking the GOP nomination.

The term of office is four years and the salary is \$25,000 annually.

## SHIRLEY

On the Democratic ticket, Samuel Piro of Southfield Hills and incumbent John F. Spry of Farmington are running for the nomination in August.

Republican candidates are Robert A. Doran of Holly and Leo R. Hearn of Wall Lake.

The term of office is four years. The salary is \$28,000.

## CLERK-REGISTER OF DEEDS

Incumbent Lynn D. Allen of Dryden Plains is seeking the GOP nomination. Mary Ann Garlick of Royal Oak also is supported for the Democratic nomination.

Clerks serve four-year terms, and the salary is currently \$28,000 a year.

## TREASURER

David M. Colborn of Bloomfield Hills is seeking the Democratic nomination. Incumbent C. Hugh Dobson of Southfield is supported for the Republican nomination for treasurer.

The term of office is four years. The salary is set at \$28,000 annually.

## DRAIN COMMISSIONER

A total of six candidates, three from each party, is seeking the office of drain commissioner.

Democratic candidates are Charles B. Edwards of Madison Heights, William M. Richards of Royal Oak and Paul J. Cunningham of Troy. On the GOP ticket are Frank R. Ballard of Pontiac, Daniel W. Barry of Union Lake and incumbent commissioner George W. Kahn of West Bloomfield Township.

# DNA research approved at UM

Recombinant DNA research can now proceed at University of Michigan because a committee appointed to examine the social, legal and ethical implications of the research has given it a seal of approval.

Recombinant DNA is the process of joining genes from one type of species to those of another, resulting in new genes for which no natural formation is known.

Genes, which are composed of DNA (deoxyribonucleic acid), are the basic units of heredity.

Experiments like this have been used in germ warfare research and are capable of producing strains of organisms of a highly resistant and deadly nature.

The possibility of recombinant DNA research at UM has caused some consternation among the college community.

Committee B, composed of 11 UM faculty members from various fields, was established last fall for this reason.

The committee's recently issued report recommended that the research "should, in principle, go forward so long as it is subordinated to appropriate controls."

One committee member dissented on the final report.

Controls mentioned in the report included a recommendation that the research should conform to guidelines prepared by the National Institutes of Health, with an added restriction that no high risk experiments requiring strict laboratory containment be permitted without the consent of the UM Board of Regents.
