

Farmington trackmen run past city rivals

Southfield-Lathrup and Farmington claimed "city championships" in boys track last week by beating in-town rivals in traditional season-ending meets.

Lathrup added its season with a 54 overall record by defeating Southfield High, 11-51, last Thursday on the Chargers' track. Farmington posted an 84 final record by scoring 87½ points to win a tri-meet with Farmington Harrison (44 points) and North Farmington (38).

Coach Gerald Young's Farmington squad won nine of the meet's 14 events. Senior Brian Shustoff was a double winner, taking the 100-yard hurdle and the mile run in 4:32.8, and the long jump in 21-4½. Shustoff also ran in the 800-yard relay (including Ron Hill, Dan Jamieson and Vance Gutierrez), which won in 3:24.1. Hill gave the Falcons another first by winning the 100-yard dash in :19.2. Farmington came through with first in both long distance events as Harold Rutala won the mile run in 4:32.8, and Stuart Gelfer took the 1000-yard run in 16:47.7.

Other Farmington firsts included the pole vault (Marty Popp at 124), the shot put (Rick McKibben at 44), the 400 yard (Kevin Hansen at 1:30.4), and the 400 yard relay and the 400 yard dash, both won by Dave Hatfield in 1:14.4.

North Farmington had a double winner in David Levy, who won the 800-yard run in 2:03.4 and the 400-yard dash in 1:24.4.

North's Bob Miller won the 100-yard dash in :19.2 and season's Paul Reed won the 200-yard dash in :32.1. North's mile relay won in 3:24.1.

LATHRUP WON 10 events, including the pole vault where Scott Ograsman won 12-6. But the meet turned out to be an upset for Ograsman, who broke his arm when he missed the landing pit during a vaulting effort.

"It was a tough break for Ograsman," said Lathrup coach Jerry Muehlenberg. "This would have been his last chance to break the school record. He was vaulting very well lately. He made 13-6 at the county meet."

Another Lathrup vocalist, Bob Driscoll, had qualified for the state finals. But he didn't compete against Southfield because he injured his hip in the Oakland County Meet last month.

Lathrup's Brian Gould was two individual events — the 100-yard dash (:19.2) and the 200-yard dash (:32.1) — and also ran in the 800 relay (with Tony Pecoreau, Dave Smith and Mike Driscoll), which won in 3:24.1.

Pecoreau won the long jump (24-4½), and Driscoll won the 400 (:1:30.4). Other Lathrup firsts came in the two-mile (Dave Hatfield in 10:22.1), the high jump (Gary Hawthorne at 5-1), and the 800 (Howard Labe in 2:03.4).

Southfield had a pair of double winners in sophomore Kevin Kola, striking out two and walking one, and Dave Walworth. Kola hit the home run in the 10th inning and last night's 5-1 victory. Walworth hit the home run in the 10th inning and last night's 5-1 victory.

Delp pitched the whole game for Farmington, fanning six and walking six. Two of Harrison's four runs were earned.

Farmington pounded out 13 hits in its victory over Groves. The Falcons scored five runs in the first inning as winning pitcher Andy Postle belted a three-run homer. Meyer and Curtis Pauline each knocked in a run, and Rob Patrick doubled in two runs as the winners added four more runs in the second inning. Mark Murray closed a solo homer in the fifth.

Postle gave up nine hits, struck out eight and walked two. The victory ended Farmington's season at 15-4 overall.

Coach Jerry Maxwell's North Farmington team ended its season with a 7-11 overall mark, including the pre-district loss to Stevenson. "Stevenson started early and fast," Maxwell said. "They scored six runs in the first three innings."

Ron Colson had a triple and two singles drive in two runs, and Jim Boyler tripled and singled to knock in four more for Stevenson, which had 14 hits.

Raider '9' drops finale Harrison nips Farmington, 4-3

It took Farmington Harrison nine innings, but coach John Harrison's team finally defeated district-rival Farmington High, 4-3, in a pre-district baseball game last week. The victory qualified Harrison for the state Class A district tournament at Southfield High School. The loss eliminated Farmington from post-season tournament play.

In other area baseball last week, Farmington ended its season on a bright note by beating Birmingham Groves, 10-4, in a non-league contest. Livonia Stevenson downed North Farmington, 10-4, a pre-district qualifier last Thursday. Detroit Country Day School beat Southfield High, 7-4, in the season finale for the Blue Jays.

Harrison, which had lost to Farmington earlier in the season, came up with a big run in the ninth to win the pre-district clash. Paul Rogstad singled and went to third on Kyle Krupsky's single. Krupsky then stole second. Tim Hanna singled, the ninth hit off Farmington rightlander Kevin Delp, and the winning run crossed the plate.

Harrison broke a scoreless tie by scoring two runs in the fifth. With two out, Rogstad walked, Krupsky singled, and both runners advanced on a Farmington error. Gregg Matlack then reached base on another error, allowing both runners to score.

Farmington took a brief lead with three runs in the sixth. Kevin Kamman singled, took second on Randy Meyer's single and scored on John Hurley's single. Rob Patrick then delivered a double to drive in two more runs.

North Farmington scored three runs in the sixth. Mike Thomas drove in two runs with a single and a sacrifice fly. Turnman Mark Bentley and Kevin McCann each drove in a run.

Stevenson's John Kola was the winning pitcher. He lasted five innings, allowing six hits, striking out nine and walking six. North Farmington has been some ragged competition this season, according to Maxwell.

Farmington Harrison compiled nine points and finished in a first-place tie with Northville in the Western Six League meet last week at Livonia Churchill. Harrison finished third in the final league standings, considering its 6-4 league dual record.

North Farmington track coach Ron Holland should be very pleased with Dunkel Junior High School's track squad. Dunkel is a feeder school for North Farmington, and the Dunkel ninth-graders just completed an excellent season.

Dunkel, coached by Greg Grodzicki, capped a perfect 6-0 dual meet season by winning the Oakland County Junior High Track Meet at West Bloomfield High June 2. Dunkel topped the 6-school meet with 50 team points. Runners up Avondale and Troy Albion scored 44 points.

Mike Miller was an individual standout for Dunkel. He won two events, setting a meet record in the 100-yard high hurdle with a 21.5 clocking, and then won the 200-yard dash in :32.1. "Miller is a fine athlete," said Grodzicki, who teaches physical education and math at Dunkel. "Everything he touches seems to turn to gold."

Another Dunkel sprinter, Jeff Cohen, won the 100-yard dash in :18.1.

Grodzicki, who has coached track for six years at Dunkel, had a large turnout — about 80 eighth-and-ninth graders. That total includes plenty of students.

"We have a 100-foot dash thrower in Mark Behl," Grodzicki said. "That's an exceptional thrower for a ninth grader. And Rich Barrell has pole vaulted over 11 feet."
