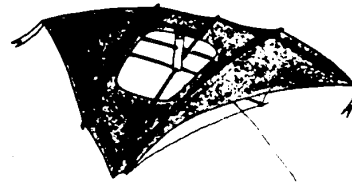
### Araucz-Johnson

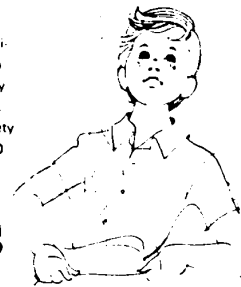

## Revolutionary War vet descendants gather

Levi Green, Revolutionary War veteran buried in North Farmington Cemetery, was honored on Memorial Day by members of his family and the Quakertown Chapter of Daughters of the American Revolution.

"It really was quite a reunion, as some of these people hadn't seen each other in decades," said Mrs. Bruce Robinson, who is regent for the local DAR chapter. Quakertown Chapter is very proud to have been the instrument of its happening and proud also to have been able to pay tribute to a Revolutionary War soldier," she said.

Two Farmington residents were among the 25 descendants of Green who attended the marking of the grave. Green's great granddaughter Mrs. Elmer J. See is a fourth generation member of the soldier, and Dr. Lee Halsted is a great-grandson, a fifth generation member. Green's grave is located just to the left from the south entrance to the cemetery, and about halfway back into the cemetery located on Farmington Road north of Thirteen Mile.

An earlier plaque was placed between the grave markers of Green and his wife.

Asenath, designating him as the only Revolutionary War soldier known to be buried in this area.

THE PLAQUE was placed by the DAR this week in observance of the bicentennial. It listed him as a Ranger in Albany Company, New York, who fought in the Battle of Bennington.

Fourth to eighth generations were represented at the ceremony, including seven great-great-great-great-grandchildren who seem to assure continuation of the line of the local link with the Revolutionary past.

The youngest member of the family is Mark Patten, son of Mrs. Milton Patten of Keego Harbor.

Persons living in the area who retain the Green family name are Mr. and Mrs. Roger Green of Southfield and their three children. He is a great-great-grandson.

(Others are Mr. and Mrs. Wendall Green, a great-great-grandson, and Mrs. Bernadine Green, all of West Bloomfield. She is a great-great-granddaughter-in-law, who possesses letters, papers and documents pertaining to the life of the Revolutionary War soldier.

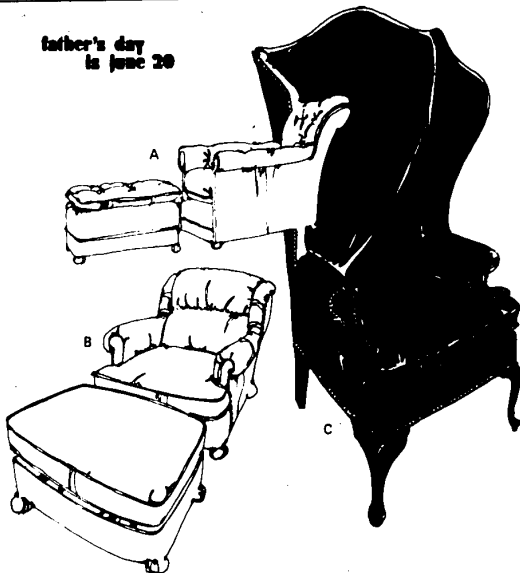
