Woman's Economic Club elects Chris Meyers

Chris Meyers, director of publicity for J. L. Hudson Company and "Ad Woman of the Year" in 1975, has been voted president of the Women's Economic Club. "Looking forward to the 1976-77 year, it is my goal that the Women's Economic Club will continue its high standard of excellence in offering quality programming, a well-rounded, interesting mix of speakers covering topics which affect women in particular and people in general," she said.

Mrs. Meyers graduated summa cum laude from North Farmington High School in 1964 when she was Christine Adamski, then graduated cum laude from University of Michigan, and now makes her home in Birmingham.

Her work career began as general assignment reporter for the Detroit Free Press. In 1968 she joined General Motors as editor for a plant newspaper, and in 1969 joined Hudson where she now directs the total operations for generating internal and external publicity.

She has been on the board of directors and served as first vice-president of the Women's Economic Club since she joined the club in 1970.

"THE VALUE in an organization such as the Women's Economic Club is far reaching," she said. It provides not only a forum to hear excellent speakers, but also a place to meet a broad range of women.

"Establishing good business contact coupled with the exchange of ideas encourage cooperation and leadership in the business community."

The club meets once a month in the Veterans Memorial Building in Detroit. Members heard Dr. Edythe Harnes talk on "Sex Hormones and Executive Ability," in May. The program for June will be a talk by Connecticut Governor Ellen Grasso. All of the speakers invited to meetings address topics of current social, political, cultural and economic concern.


The club was chartered in 1962 to provide a meeting ground for career people from every facet of the business, professional, industrial, academic, communications, cultural and governmental communities. It offers members the opportunity to meet, hear and question firsthand the people who make the headlines.

It was the first club of its kind for women in the United States and has averaged an increase in membership of more than 40 percent each year.

"Another goal of mine," Mrs. Meyers said, "will be that of increasing our membership in all age groups, but especially those young women in the working world."

She continued to say that the club "is by no means closed to male membership. It is open to any person who is or has been engaged in business or professional activity as stated in our bylaws. We certainly would be pleased to have male members."
