Nardineers hear Mike Whorf at annual dinner banquet

The Nardineers, a senior citizen organization at Nardin Park Methodist Church, Farmington Hills, will hold their fifth annual banquet June 18.

Speaker for the evening event will be Mike Whorf, award-winning radio narrator, a popular speaker with Nardin Park audiences.

Welcoming Whorf will be Dr. William D. Mercer, senior minister of the church, and Mrs. Mercer, along with a large group of Nardineers. Program themes will be "Sounds of Glory."

In his daily hour-long broadcasts over WJRI, Whorf has covered many significant events in American history.

A New Englander by birth, son of an internationally recognized watercolor artist and nephew of a stage, screen and television personality, Whorf began his broadcasting career with Armed Forces radio in 1961. He began his affiliation with WJRI radio in 1964. He is a winner of the George Foster Peabody and Freedom Foundations awards.

The June 18 banquet winds down activities of the Nardineers for 1975-76. Although other activities are planned for July and August, the full program will resume in September with regular meetings on the first and third Wednesdays of each month. There will be a bicentennial trip to Gettysburg and Philadelphia in the fall.

The Nardineers started several years ago with about 40 interested persons under the Rev. Meredith Mosbauer, associate minister. Membership has expanded to more than 400. It is now an incorporated organization with an active interest in bringing the needs of retired people to the attention of the communities around them.
