Manilow signed for 2d concert

Harry Manilow, one of the hottest attractions on the jazz concert circuit, has signed to make a second appearance in August at Meadow Brook Music Festival.

Originally booked for Friday, Aug. 27, Manilow has agreed to an additional performance Wednesday evening, Aug. 25, according to Leon Petrus, managing director of the summer series on Oakland University campus.

"Manilow's Aug. 27 appearance was a complete sell-out before our season even opened last Thursday," Petrus said. "In the face of such unprecedented demand, we went to work and arranged for the Aug. 25 additional date."

Tickets for the Aug. 25 performance go on sale at 9 a.m. July 5, Petrus said.

at the Meadow Brook box office, off Walton west of Adams, in Rochester. They will be available only at the box office Monday through Wednesday. Thereafter, as long as tickets are available, they can be purchased at Meadow Brook through ticket services of Hudson's, Sears and Montgomery Ward, and by phone or mail. There is a limit of four tickets to any one person, Petrus said.

The box office will accept phone orders for the Aug. 25 concert only after July 7. Starting July 8, phone orders will be accepted at (313) 377-2010.

Manilow's two late August performances will cap a 10-week jazz series at Meadow Brook that has already produced the first pro-union pavilion sell-out in the 18-year history of the festival.
