The City of Farmington Hills Planning Commission will give formal consideration to a Proposed Amendment (Resolving Ordinance PC-7478) which would rezone part of the Southeast 1/4 of Section 10, City of Farmington Hills, County of Oakland, State of Michigan, being more particularly described as:

Part of the Southeast 1/4 of Section 10, Town of North, Range 9 East, beginning at a point distant East 185 feet from the South 1/4 corner, thence East 173.30 feet, thence West 61.73 feet, thence North 400.78 feet, thence East 378.73 feet, thence South 640.0 feet, thence West 317.8 feet to the beginning thereof.

This property lies directly 200' West of Orchard Lake Road on the North side of Twelve Mile Road.

The above-mentioned request would rezone the above-mentioned property from its present SP-1 (Special Purpose District) to R-3 (Multiple-Family Residential District).

The proponent in this matter is the Farmington Hills Planning Commission who seeks this rezoning in order to bring the above-mentioned land (the Williamsburg Townhouses) into the proper zoning classification for which it is being used. There will be no new multiple units in this area.

Any person who is interested in participating in the discussion of the proposed zoning change,Blueprints and maps and zoning laws may be observed at the Farmington Hills City Hall on any business day between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.
