

Farmington whips Waterford

Area trackmen should add lots of carrots to their diet if they plan on running any night meets at Waterford Township.

Farmington High had an Inter Lakes League meet at Waterford last Thursday, and the trackmen really needed their night vision. The lights at Waterford couldn't be turned on because no one had a key for a locked control box.

Farmington won the meet, 117-41, but things things looked bleak for both teams toward the end. "By the time we got to the 220-yard dash, it was almost totally dark," said Farmington coach Gerald Young.

Farmington senior Kevin Hansen won both weight events, throwing the shot 52.4 and heaving the discus 138-

34 for a varsity record. Teammate Mike Hanna, who has logged some of the fastest 120-yard high hurdles times in the state so far this season, won the highs in .15.8.

Another Farmington hurdler, Greg Lahr, won the 330 low hurdles in :41.2. Farmington won the 880 relay (Stu Glatfelter, Kim Watzki, Dan Jamison and Chris Titus) in 1:36.3. Rick McKibben won the high jump at 64. Hugh Leidein won the mile in 4:42.7, and Harold Rutala took the two mile in 10:28.7.

IN ANOTHER meet last Thursday night, Waterford Mott defeated Farmington Harrison, 84-74, in a Western Six League meet at Mott.

Harrison could have tied the meet had it won the last event, the mile relay. However, Harrison was dis-

qualified for cutting off a Mott runner. The loss left coach Tom Shalla's Harrison team with a 4-1 record. Harrison's Mike Bowden won the weights with a varsity-record 157.7 in the discus and a 437 in the shot. Mike Colomina won the pole vault at 10.6. John Hileman won the 330 lows in :41.9. Jim Stojek won the 120 highs in 16.7, and Mark Evans topped the mile in 4:42.0.

The boys' track city championship will be decided next Tuesday (May 3) when Farmington, Harrison and North Farmington meet in the annual tri-meet. The contest is scheduled for 4 p.m. at Harrison.

Harrison '9' rallies; Farmington slips by HP

Farmington Harrison's baseball team proved that there's some truth in that old adage about never saying die.

Harrison needed a last-minute rally to win two games last week. Harrison came from behind to defeat Waterford 8-4 last Wednesday, and then rallied to overcome Waterford Mott, 4-3, a day later. The victories lifted coach John Harrison's Harrison squad to 3-2 overall.

In the Mott game, Harrison was down by two runs (3-1) after the first inning, but the tawks came back with a two-run homer by Craig Fuller in the sixth, and a game-winning single by Vin Dahm in the seventh.

Winning pitcher Brett Homovec, a junior right-hander, went all the way, giving up three hits, striking out eight and walking four.

Mathiak was the winning pitcher, lifting his record to 2-0 this season. He allowed three hits, fanned eight and walked four. Only one of the Western runs was earned. Harrison made five errors.

Harrison plays next on Monday (May 2) at home against Northville High. The Western Six League game begins at 4 p.m.


