

Beautification month highlighted with sale

Farmington Beautification Commission will mark May, designated as "Keep Farmington Beautiful Month" with its third annual flower and shrub sale, set for May 20-21 in the Downtown Center parking lot.

Trays and flats of marigolds, petunias, begonias and other bright flowers will be sold by committee members. Participating merchants will sell evergreens, shrubs, flowering shrubs, trees and hanging baskets.

Businesses cooperating with the sale are Steinkopf Nursery, Springbrook Gardens and Plant Boutique. Simultaneously, the Viking Shop will be selling the yellow T-shirts with the beautification committee's symbol.

Meanwhile, school children have been notified of the annual spring con-

test the committee sponsors every year and will be writing essays on what they think needs beautifying in their community.

Award winners will receive their contest prizes publicly in the Downtown Center during the sale days.

The sale is being carried on to promote gardening, general spring repair and spring cleaning in the city.

In turn, the proceeds will be used for area plantings with a pink and blue theme. The committee regularly maintains several beauty spots with spring plantings.

Sale hours are from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Friday, and from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday.
