Thurston downs Farmington

Harrison netters top Canton

Farmington Harrison won every match except No. 4 singles and downed Plymouth Canton, 6-1, in A Western Six League tennis meet last Thursday at Canton. The victory lifted coach Bernie Goldstein's Harrison netters to 5-1 overall and 4-1 in the WSL.

In other area tennis meets last week, North Farmington lost two matches, dropping a 4-3 decision to Northville High and a 5-2 verdict to Livonia Stevenson. Thurston defeated Farmington High 4-3, in another non-league meet last Thursday.

Harrison's Danny Green won the No. 1 singles match with a 6-4, 6-2 victory over Canton's Steve Pasley. In No. 2 singles, Harrison's Bob Malitz stopped Kurt Hopfinger in three sets, 6-3, 6-4, 6-3. Canton's lone match came in No. 4 singles, where Chris Davis beat Mark Diekmann, 6-4, 6-4.

No. 3 doubles was the key match in the Northville-North Farmington meet. The Northville team of John Marzoni and Lance Carter bested Tom Clancy and Brian Hartley, 6-4, 6-3.

North's top singles player, David

Epstein, continues to play well. Against Northville, he beat Doug Castillo, a strong player, 6-2, 6-4. Epstein defeated Stevenson's Kevin Green, 6-1, 6-4.

Farmington coach Richard Burgess shook up his lineup for the Thurston meet. Keith Farnie, who usually plays at No. 1 singles for Farmington, found himself teamed with Greg Murland in No. 3 doubles. The Falcon duo stopped Stewart Holmes and Tim Merkel, 6-2, 6-3. Farmington is 1-5 overall.

North Farmington plays next on Monday (May 9) at home against Westland John Glenn. Harrison has a home meet against Waterford Mott, and Farmington High moves to Pontiac Northern. All meets begin at 4 p.m.

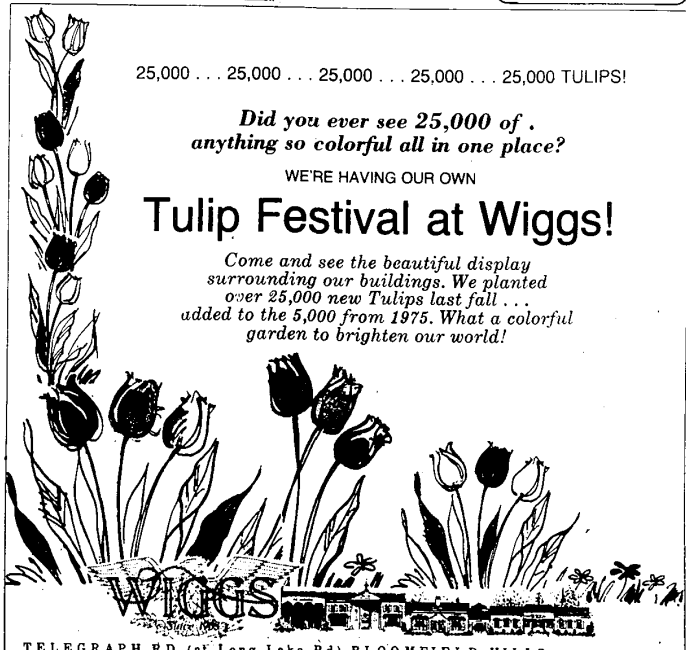
