

Anglers can snag cash prizes

A statewide fishing awards program with prizes up to \$25,000 per person is being sponsored by the Michigan United Conservation Clubs.

Any angler who is registered for the event—known as "Fisharama"—will be paid \$25,000 if he or she catches a world record fish in Michigan waters between March 1 and Dec. 31. If the angler lands a state record fish, MUCC will pay \$1,000.



In the past five years, according to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, state fish records have been broken 26 times. Fishery experts say world records for several species are possible in Michigan.

Anyone who holds a Michigan sport fishing license may take part in Fisharama by paying a \$1 entry fee. Entry forms are available at fishing li-

cense dealers throughout the state. All proceeds from Fisharama will be used to help finance conservation programs carried out by MUCC, a non-profit alliance of sportspeople and conservationists.

Fish entered in Fisharama must be caught by lawful sport fishing methods and must be certified by the DNR's Fisheries Division.

THE \$1,000 AND \$25,000 prizes will be offered for 20 species. They are Lake sturgeon (130 pounds), Great Lakes muskie (62 pounds, eight ounces), Lake trout (35 pounds), channel catfish (47 pounds, eight ounces), flathead catfish (38 pounds, two ounces), chinook salmon (44 pounds, two ounces), brown trout (6 pounds, two ounces), rainbow trout (three pounds, 12 ounces), yellow perch (three pounds, 12 ounces), rock bass (three

pounds, 10 ounces), bluegill (two pounds, 10 ounces), Atlantic salmon (22 pounds, one ounce), northern pike (39 pounds) and coho salmon (30 pounds, eight ounces).

"NO RESERVATIONS Needed" is the title of a 20-minute film illustrating the parks and facilities of the Huron-Clinton Metropark system, which is available for public viewing by residents and civic organizations throughout the counties of Livingston, Macomb, Oakland, Washtenaw and Wayne.

Introduced in April, 1972, the film is acclaimed by viewers whenever shown. Reservations should be made well in advance of the desired date for film use.

EMU sets nuclear medicine program

The Eastern Michigan University Board of Regents has approved a proposal to grant a bachelor's degree in nuclear medicine technology.

The program, unique in Michigan, will be implemented in the 1977 fall semester.

The new curriculum at Eastern, a cooperative effort with the nuclear medicine section of University Hospital in Ann Arbor, will include three years of course work at EMU followed by a 12-month internship at University Hospital to study the specialized aspects of nuclear medicine technology.

Nuclear medicine technologists work under the direction of a physician and utilize radioisotope materials to aid in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases.

Students entering the program at Eastern will be required to take anatomy, radiation biology, general and organic chemistry, pathology, radioisotope technology, physics and other courses. Students will be required to earn at least a 2.5 grade point average in these courses and no grade below a "C" in any science course.

After completing the basic course work, students may apply for admission to the program.
