Trustees plan bond sale

Schoolcraft College trustees moved a step closer to selling a \$10 million construction bond issue last week following passage of a resolution of intent.

The actual hard decision to sell the bonds awaits results of the 0.8 mill property tax increase request in the June 13 election. While the tax hike won't be used to pay off the bonds, it will be needed to operate the new and remodeled buildings.

The bonds will be in denominations of \$5,000. It will take 2,000 such bonds to raise \$10 million.

THE BONDS will be paid off serially beginning in 1989 and running until 1995.

They will be coupon bonds—that is, the buyer will clip a coupon each May 1 and Dec. 1 and collect from the bank or trust company designated as paying agent.

Bids will determine the actual interest rate, but the board resolution specifies it should not exceed eight percent.

Kenneth Lindner, the college's vice-president for business, expects a single underwriter will purchase the entire bond issue and re-sell them to investors, who may be banks, insurance companies, pension funds, trusts and even individuals.

THE BOARD vote was 6-0. Trustees

Leroy Bennett and Arch Vallier were absent.

Bennett is hospitalized and scheduled to undergo surgery next week. But Board Chairman Paul Y. Kadish reported Bennett is in cheerful spirits and is making telephone calls to legislators on behalf of the college from his hospital bed.

With the funds from the bond issue, the board plans to:

- Build, furnish and equip a culinary arts addition. It will allow the college to double enrollment in this program, for which there is currently a year-long waiting list.
- Build, furnish and equip a learning resource center, which would replace the library.
- Remodel, furnish and equip the existing library, mainly for offices. Several specialized colleges are located in houses with septic tanks along Haggerty Road, and the board plans to move them back to the main campus.
- Build, furnish and equip a fine arts building, which will include instructional rooms, rehearsal rooms and a major performing arts auditorium. The auditorium would be more than twice the size of any high school auditorium in the college district and put Schoolcraft in the same league as the Masonic Temple and the Ford Auditoriums in Detroit, Hill Auditorium in Ann Arbor and Pine Knob in Oakland County.
