Development Fund (ADF) now under-way in parishes throughout the Catho-lic Archdiocese of Detroit. The annual appeal, now in its 35th year, provides for ongoing works of re-ligion, education and charity in Wayne. Oakland, Macomb, Lapeer, Monroe and St. Clair Counties.
