

JCs Sponsor Track Meet

Farmington Jaycees will sponsor an area-wide Junior Champ track and field meet for boys and girls ages eight to 18 on June 21 at Farmington High School.

Entry blanks are being circulated in each school and reprinted here in The Enterprise & Observer. There will be five age groups participating: 8-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-16 and 17-18. Medals will be awarded for the first three places.

Farmington winners will qualify to enter the state tournament in Detroit on July 19. On June 21, the pee wee and junior divisions will be run from 9-11:30 a.m. The prep, intermediate

and senior divisions will run in the afternoon from 1 to 3:30.

Deadline for submitting entries is June 17. Events scheduled for the meet include: 60-yard, 100-yard and 220-yard dash; broad and high jump; shot put; low and high hurdles; 440-yard, 880-yard, mile and two mile runs; and pole vault. For further information, contact John Finlayson at 474-2662.

Oakland County Circuit Judge William R. Beasley will be the featured speaker for Kendalwood One and Colony Park's Fourth of July observance. Judge Beasley is expected to talk on the theme of the observance, "Foreign Contributions to American Independence."

His talk is scheduled to begin at 11:20 a.m. at the Wooddale Elementary School. Judge Beasley, a member of the Oakland County law enforcement committee, is a 1942 graduate of University of Michigan Law School. He was elected to a six-year term on the Oakland County Circuit Court in 1966.

A navy veteran, he is a former president of both the county bar association and legal aid society. He has served as city attorney for Huntington Woods and Ferndale and as attorney for school boards in Birmingham and Ferndale.

He was also a city commissioner in Ferndale and served on the Ferndale Library Board.

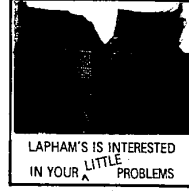

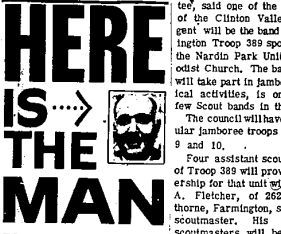

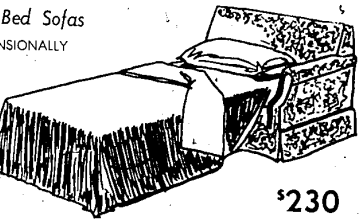
