Need Someplace To Hang Your Hat? Orchard Ridge Is Where It's At

More and more Farmington residents are discovering what a convenience it is to have the Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College right on the doorstep.

More and more local groups are scheduling meetings at the campus, perhaps because the surroundings are attractive, certainly because they are nearby and maybe because the college makes it so easy to use them.

BUT NOT generally known in Farmington is that facilities at the Martin Luther King Jr. Learning Resources Center are also available for public use.

Familiarly known as the LRC, the center is more than a library and students from all schools will find it adds to the effectiveness of their studies. More than that, it can add to the pleasure of the leisure hours of the average man on the street.

The center differs from the conventional library because it not only houses books, it handles all other instructional media and equipment used in the educational process. It is useful as a library, a learning laboratory, a media center and a pleasant place in which to spend some time.

INCLUDED in the center's collection are 30,000 volumes, 2,000 pamphlets and 425 subscriptions to current title periodicals, with backfiles to the 1950's on microfilm.

The center staff includes three professional librarians, one educational media specialist, three library technicians and one audiovisual technician.

The LRC also maintains a collection of popular books and best sellers either for leisure reading or for information on timely or controversial topics.

And browsing, a socially accepted form of wasting time and having fun is emphatically encouraged.

HOW DO you avail yourself of these services?

Simply visit the center in Building K every time between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. Monday - Thursday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Fridays and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. Sundays.

You will be asked to identify yourself and fill out a guest card.

This done, the center is yours, with all its wonderful books and research material, its micro-readers, its eight conference rooms, its free-of-charge typing rooms and typewriters, all of it.

Center director is Mrs. Louise Giles, an associate dean, and she will be glad to see you.
