

Pontiac Trail Is Open

Chief Pontiac Trail, established and maintained by the Clinton Valley Council, Boy Scouts of America, is open for hiking for the 11th consecutive year.

Scout units throughout the metropolitan area and state and other organizations with hiking programs are invited to take the 25-mile foot and canoe route through scenic portions of Oakland County. The trail begins at the Chief Pontiac marker on Commerce Rd. at the northeast corner of Orchard Lake and ends in the group camp area of Kensington Metropolitan Park. The trail involves two days of hiking and closely follows old Indian trails from Orchard Lake westward to Proulx Lake, the first and only overnight campsite. Either a foot or canoe trail can be taken the remaining distance to Kensington.

Boys making the hike must be at least a first class Scout or an Explorer equivalent and must complete certain requirements to qualify for a special Chief Pontiac Trail medal and patch.

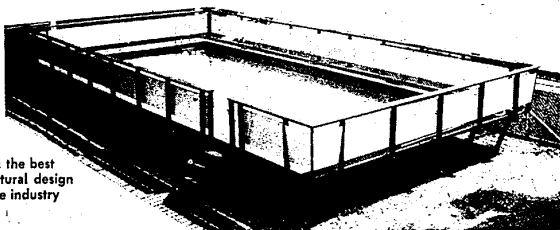
