## Test detects glaucoma

You can help protect yourself against glaucoma—cause of 14 per cent of America's blindness—by knowing what not to look for.

That's because the disease, known as "the sneak thief of sight," usually offers no early clues to its presence. It

usually causes no pain and has no symptoms.

Yet it advances slowly, destroying vision, until it eventually causes blindness.

Glaucoma can be detected by a special device called the tonometer in a short, simple and painless process.

Experts at the National Society for the Prevention of Blindness support a Glaucoma Alert Program and urge people over 35 to have their eyes examined at least once every two years—because glaucoma can be medically treated and arrested.
