OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

All interested citizens are advised that the Oakland County Road Commission is proposing the improvement of the following intersection: the location and nature of the project (s) being indicated below.

The proposed improvement of the following intersection is being done in the public interest to improve safety and traffic capacity. The cost of this work is to be paid from State Motor Vehicle Funds and Federal Highway Trust Funds.

Information, plans for these improvements, and an Environmental Impact Statement are available for inspection at the Oakland County Road Commission office, 31001 Lahser Road, Birmingham, Michigan 48010, mental, and economic effects of such improvement.

Under provisions of the Federal Law any citizen who may be affected by the proposed project may request, in writing, that the Oakland County Road Commission hold a public hearing concerning the social, environmental, and economic effects of such improvement.

Such written request should be mailed to the Oakland County Road Commission office, and such request must be received on or before June 28, 1977.

Widen Grand River east and west of Novi Road from 4 to 5 lanes for 400 feet each way. Relocate 11 Mile Road from its intersection with Novi Road and Grand River to a point 1/2 mile easterly of the intersection and construct on the relocation a 3 lane pavement.

City of Farmington Hills Summary of Proceedings City Council Meeting May 23, 1977

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills met in Regular Session at City Hall on May 23, 1977. Mayor Deacon called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. Council Members present were: Amort, Dodan, Dudley, Lichman, Oppenheimer, and Smith. Others present were: City Manager Majors, Assistant City Clerk Thomas, and City Attorney Bibeau.

After Cost Hearing, Special Assessment Roll in amount of \$28,400 for sewer improvements for Crestview, Treasins' Little Farms and Supervisors' Mier Farms was unanimously confirmed.

After Public Hearing, necessary declared for road resurfacing S.A.D. in Briar Hill Subdivision.

After Public Hearing, Roosevelt Street from Eight Mile to Dresden was unanimously returned "Willow Lane".

After Public Hearing Amending Ordinance No. C88-66 to rezone from (L1.1) light industrial use to (E2) expressway service use property located on the north side of Grand River Avenue just west of 1400 unanimously approved.

After Public Hearing, necessary declared for road resurfacing S.A.D. in Hilly Hill Farms Subdivision.

After Public Hearing, motion to submit 1977-78 Community Development application to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for funding of programs designed to prevent and/or eliminate blight and deteriorating of the City's housing unanimously approved.

Ralph Magid, Director of Public Services directed to report to Council on the status of site improvements in the alley behind the William's Office Center at 2825 Grand River Avenue.

Contract awarded to Velocet Chemical Corporation to supply calcium chloride for dust control on approximately 40 miles of gravel roads only, the amount not to exceed \$60,000 approved by a vote of 6-1. Lichman opposed.

Legal advertising requirement waived and contract awarded unanimously to Stock Brothers, Inc. for storm sewer cleaning along Greenway Court, Glencastle, and Appleton Street flows in the amount of \$5,600.

Preliminary Plan for Green Hills Woods Subdivision located west of Haledale Road on Nine Mile Road approved 6-1. Mr. Lichman opposed.

Delinquent S.A.D. payments to be added to the 1977 Tax Rolls passed unanimously.

Notice of intent to issue bonds for the following S.A.D. roads: Meadowbrook Hills No. C88, New Market Road No. C88, Springbrook Road No. C88, and Woodbrook Road No. C88 unanimously approved.

Proposal by Public Administration Service to conduct a managerial audit of City operations in the amount of \$11,400 accepted 5-1. Mr. Lichman opposed and Mr. Oppenheimer abstained.

Transfer of Major Road Funds in amount of \$83,842 to Local Road Funds passed unanimously.

Supplemental appropriation for retroactive police salary adjustments in the amount of \$80,000 to be funded from unappropriated reserve funds unanimously approved with Oakland County Road Commission to install a flashing signal light at Fourteen Mile and Farmington Road, the City's share of the cost being \$80,000, unanimously approved.

Agreement with Michigan State Highway Commission regarding additional land-use along I-480, the City's participation cost being \$212,134, unanimously approved.

Reestablishment of a S.A.D. for road paving near and at the intersection of Nine Mile and Haledale Road unanimously approved.

Agreement by Custer Construction Company to locate a concrete batch plant on Eight Mile Road west of the Plancha Cultural Center subject to \$10,000 bond to insure compliance by October 1, 1977 unanimously approved.

Meeting adjourned at 1:30 A.M.
