Court asked to stop highway cancellation

Amnesia claimed in MD's sex case

Testimony was completed last week in the trial of Dr. Don R. Krohn on a charge of second-degree crumnal sevual conduct. The case is being tried by Oakland County Circuit Court Judge William Beer.

The doctor, a Parmington Hills resident and chief of obstetries and gynecology at Providence Hospital in Southfield, was accused by a West Bloomfield woman of entering ber home last October and making sexual advances before she was rescued by two neighbors.

"I recall nothing other than stand-ing, knocking on a door. My last vivid recollection was having the drambuies (after dinner)." Krohn tes-tified.

DR. KROHN testified he remembers being in an officer's scout car and being taken to township hall, then to Oakland County jail where he was released the following day on \$10,000 bond.

A breathalizer test administered at

sought medical advice, fearing he had

KROHN'S DEFENSE also claims his home is similar to that of the woman bringing suit. This led Judge Beer to adjourn court proceedings Thursday to compare the two homes and see the restaurant where the doctor had been that evening and prosecution were heard Friday. A court spokesman said there is no way of predicting when a verdict would be announced by Beer.

Maximum penalty for the accused, if convicted, is 15 years in jail.

IN TS SUIT, the road commission is attempting to force the state to live up to an original 1875 contract to extend Northwesten. The state according to the road commission, to build Northwesten from Eight Mile. Road in Detroit across Southfield, West Bloomfield, Commerce. White Lake, Highland and Rose townships joining U.S. 23 near Fenton. Northwestern was built to its present ending at Orchard Lake Road in the 180s and its final termination reported when M-275 was proposed 10 years ago.

The new plan was to extend North-the report of the court o

western 9.3 miles into Commerce to in-tersect with M-275 near the Haggerty and Richardson road intersection. But M-275, which would have linked 1-96 near Novi to 1-75 near Holly was cancelled by the highway commission in January.
