How to get news in the paper

When you submit information for a news article in Observer & Eccentric newspapers, keep in mind the following pointers. By following these recommendations, you will save delays and avoid errors.
• Be certain you give us complete information. It's better to submit too much information than too little.
• When an individual's name is to be used in an article, be sure to give us the first and last name. For instance, you and the members of your church may know that Rev. Smith's first name is John, but our other readers may not.

• Be certain that the information is readable. Illegible information is the prime cause of errors in any newspaper.
• Be sure to include your own name and telephone number. If you have accidentally omitted information or if we cannot read your writing we will still have a means of checking the information.
• If you plan to submit a photograph with an article, be sure that it is a good one. A sharp, black-and-white glossy photograph is best, but even color photos will work if they are in focus and have good contrast.
