Farmington grads hear speakers at ceremonies

The finale of 18 years of education for 1,378 Farmington School District students marks next week graduation celebrations for three Farmington high schools.

Among parents, friends and school board members attending the commencement ceremonies at Ford Auditorium will be three commencement speakers.

Bob McBride, station manager of WJBK-TV2, will be launching Harrison High School students on their post-graduate careers on June 13 at 8 p.m. in the downtown auditorium. Farmington Board of Education Trustees Gary Lichtman and Dr. Mervyn Ross will distribute diplomas to the 410 graduating seniors.

McBride, who joined the Storer Broadcasting Co. as program manager in 1961, was named station manager in 1974. A native of Chicago, Ill., McBride has received numerous awards for his news reporting and editorials.

John H. Suehr, professor in the department of administration and higher education at Michigan State University, will deliver the commencement address for 511 Farmington High School graduates June 14 at 8 p.m. Trustees Helen Prutow and Michael Shipice will present diplomas.

A professor in the college of education at MSU, Suehr received his BS in education from Western Illinois University, Macomb, Ill., his MA from Bradley University, Peoria, Ill., and his doctorate from the University of Colorado. Employed by MSU since 1963, Suehr teaches more classes than any other professor in the department of administration and higher education.

Jack D. Seibold, associate director of admissions and scholarships at Michigan State University, has been tapped as the commencement speaker for 455 North Farmington High School graduates. Trustees William Gravius and Emma Makinen will present diplomas at the ceremonies June 15 at 8 p.m. at Ford Auditorium.

Seibold, who received his BA and MA from MSU, was assistant director of housing at MSU from 1959-63; director of housing at Ferris State College from 1963-66; admissions counselor at MSU from 1966-68; assistant director of admissions and scholarships from 1968-69, and was appointed to his present job in 1969.

In addition to the guest speakers, all members of the board of education will attend all commencement exercises. President of the board Anne Struble will deliver a message at each ceremony.
